Department of Statistics: Producer Price Index (PPI) Decreased by (0.44 %) in the first half of 2025

The Department of Statistics (DOS) issued its monthly report on the Producer Price Index (PPI), which observed a decrease by (0.44%) (less than one percentage point) in the first half of 2025 compared to the same period in 2024. On the monthly level, the PPI had decreased by (0.18%) in June 2025 compared to the same month in 2024, and increased by 0.41% compared to May 2025. Note that the base year was adjusted to (2018=100) instead of (2010=100).

Thus, the PPI of the first half of 2025 had reached 106.86 against 107.34 for the same period in 2024. On the monthly level, the PPI of June 2025 had reached 106.86 against 107.05 in June 2024 and 106.42 in May 2025.

Comparing the accumulative PPI for the first half of 2025 with the same period in 2024, the prices of “Manufacturing Industries” was decreased by (0.59%) with a relative importance 88.74%, while there were increases in the prices of “Quarrying Industries” by 0.48% with a relative importance 5.36% and the prices of “Electricity” increased by 0.88% with a relative importance of 5.91%.

On the commodities level, the decrease in the PPI of June 2025 compared to the same month of 2024 was due to the decrease in the prices of “Manufacturing Industries” by (0.70%) with a relative importance of 88.74%, while there were increases in the prices of

“Quarrying Industries” by 5.47% with a relative importance of 5.36% and the prices of “Electricity” by 2.44% with a relative importance of 5.91%.

On the monthly change domain, the PPI of June 2025 compared to May 2025 was increased due to the increase in the prices of “Manufacturing Industries” by 0.33% with a relative importance of 88.74%, the prices of “Quarrying Industries” by 2.20% with a relative importance of 5.36%, and the prices of “Electricity” by 0.06% with a relative importance of 5.91%.
