Department of Statistics: The Producer Price Index decreased by (0.38%) In March 2025

The Department of Statistics has released its monthly report on the Producer Price Index (PPI), which recorded a decrease of (0.38%) in March 2025 compared to same month in 2024, and an increase of 0.24% compared to February 2025. On a cumulative level, the PPI for the first three months of 2025 decreased by (0.11%) compared to the same period in 2024.

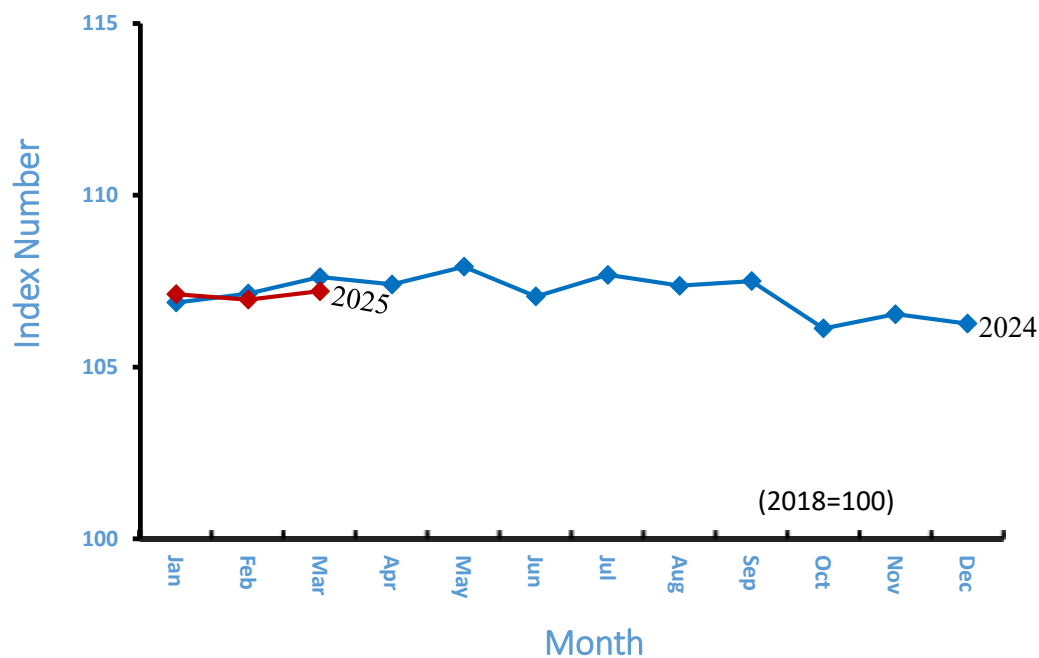
Accordingly, the Price index for March 2025 reached 107.21 against 107.62 for the same month in 2024, and reached 107.21 in march 2025 against 106.96 when compared to the previous month of February 2025. On a cumulative level, PPI for the first three months of 2025 stood at 107.09, compared to 107.21 for the same period in 2024.

On the commodity level, the decrease in the index for March 2025 compared to the same month in 2024 was primarily driven by the decrease in the prices of “Manufacturing Industries” by (0.43%) with a relative importance of 88.74% and the prices of “Quarrying Industries” by (0.69%) with a relative importance of 5.36%. Meanwhile the prices of “Electricity” increased by 0.62% with a relative importance of 5.91%.

In terms of the monthly change, the PPI for March 2025 increased compared to the previous month of February 2024 as a result of the increase in the prices of “Quarrying Industries” by 5.49%, with a relative importance of 5.36% and the prices of “Electricity” by 0.29%, with a relative importance of 5.91%. Meanwhile the prices of “Manufacturing Industries” decreased by (0.08%) with a relative importance of 88.74%.

When comparing the cumulative Producer Price Index (PPI) for the first three months of 2025 with the same period in 2024, the prices of “Quarrying Industries” decreased by (1.94%), with a relative importance of 5.36%, and the prices of “Electricity” decreased by (0.09%), with a relative importance of 5.91%.
