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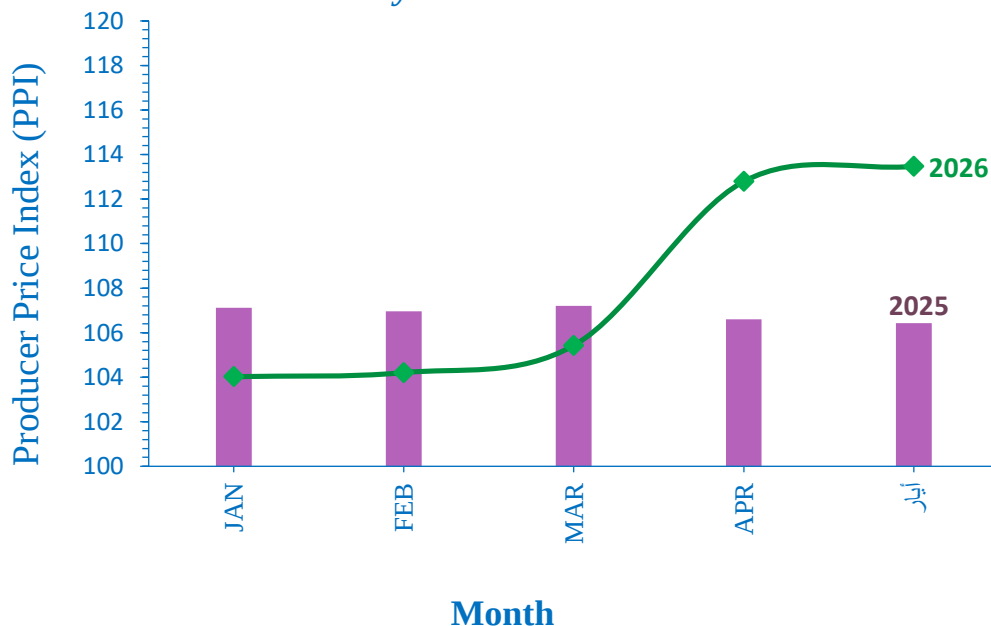

Department of Statistics: Industrial Producer Prices Increased by 1.05% in the First Five Months of 2026

The Department of Statistics (DoS) issued its monthly report on the Producer Price Index (PPI) for May 2026, which recorded an increase by 6.62% compared to May 2025, and an increase by 0.60% compared to April 2026. On the cumulative level for the first five months of 2026, the PPI had increased by 1.05% compared to the same period in 2025.

Accordingly, the PPI for the first five months of 2026 reached 107.98 against 106.86 for the same period in 2025. On a monthly basis, the PPI of May 2026 reached 113.47 compared to 106.42 for the same month in 2025. Also, the PPI of May 2026 recorded 113.47 compared to 112.79 in April 2026.

Comparing the PPI for the first five months of 2026 with the same period of 2025, there were increases in the prices of “*Manufacturing Industries*” by 0.71%, with a relative importance of 88.74%, “*Quarrying Industries*” by 6.99%, with a relative importance of 5.36%, and “*Electricity*” by 1.01%, with a relative importance of 5.91%.

On the commodity level, the increase in the PPI of May 2026 compared to the same month of 2025 was due to the increase in prices of “*Manufacturing Industries*” by 6.43%, with a relative importance of 88.74%, “*Quarrying Industries*” by 17.18%, with a relative importance of 5.36%, and prices of “*Electricity*” by 0.55%, with a relative importance of 5.91%.

On a monthly change scale, the PPI of May 2026 had increased compared to April 2026 as a result of the increase in prices of “*Manufacturing Industries*” by 0.27%, with a relative importance of 88.74%, “*Quarrying Industries*” by 6.58%, with a relative importance of 5.36%, and prices of “*Electricity*” by 0.35%, with a relative importance of 5.91%.
