Department of Statistics: Industrial Producer Prices Decreased by (0.34%) in the first third of 2026

The Department of Statistics (DOS) issued its monthly report on the Producer Price Index (PPI) for April 2026, which recorded an increase by 5.80% compared to April 2025 and an increase by 6.98% compared to March 2026. On the cumulative level for the first four months of 2026, the PPI had decreased by (0.34%) compared to the same period in 2025, noting that the base year is (2018=100).



Accordingly, the PPI for the first four months of 2026 reached 106.61 compared to 106.97 for the same period in 2025. On a monthly basis, the PPI of April 2026 reached 112.78 compared to 106.60 for the same month in 2025. Also, the PPI of April 2026 recorded 112.78 compared to 105.43 in March 2026.

Comparing the PPI for the first four months of 2026 with the same period of 2025, the prices of “*Manufacturing Industries*” decreased by (0.71%), with a relative importance of 88.74%. Meanwhile, there were increases in the prices of “*Quarrying Industries*” by 4.44%, with a relative importance of 5.36%, and the prices of “*Electricity*” by 1.12%, with a relative importance of 5.91%.

On the commodity level, the increase in the PPI of April 2026 compared to the same month of 2025 was due to the increase in prices of “*Manufacturing Industries*” by 5.93%, with a relative importance of 88.74%, prices of “*Quarrying Industries*” by 8.98%, with a relative importance of 5.36%, and prices of “*Electricity*” by 1.12%, with a relative importance of 5.91%.

On a monthly change scale, the PPI of April 2026 had increased compared to March 2026 as a result of the increase in prices of “*Manufacturing Industries*” by 7.24%, with a relative importance of 88.74%, prices of “*Quarrying Industries*” by 10.27%, with a relative importance of 5.36%, and prices of “*Electricity*” by 0.34%, with a relative importance of 5.91%.
