



Department of Statistics: Consumer Prices 1.06% for January 2026

The Department of Statistics issued its monthly report on the Consumer Prices Index (CPI) (Inflation), which observed an increase by 1.06% during January 2026 compared to the same month in 2025, and a slight increase by 0.17% (less than one percentage point) compared to December 2025.

The following table shows inflation rates for the years 2025 and 2026, and it's noted that prices remained stable during 2026.

Accordingly, the CPI for January 2026 reached 113.42 points compared to 112.23 points for the same month in 2025. The CPI of January 2026 reached 113.42 compared to 113.22 in December 2025.

On the commodity groups level, the increase in the CPI of January 2026 compared to the same month in 2025 is mainly attributed to the “*Personal Effects*” group by 38.92%, “*Oils & Fats*” group by 13.45%, “*Tea, coffee, and cocoa*” by 12.02%, “*Fruits and Nuts*” group by 4.23%, and “*Tobacco and Cigarettes*” by 3.99%. Meanwhile, there were decreases in the “*Meat and Poultry*” by (9.80%), “*Dried and Canned Vegetables & Legumes*” by (6.27%), “*Household Supplies*” by (3.28%), and “*Household Appliances*” group by (1.07%).




Among the most prominent commodity groups that contributed to increase the CPI of January 2026 compared to December 2025 were the “*Personal Effects*” group by 5.38%, “*Tobacco and Cigarettes*” by 3.98%, “*Water and Sanitation*” by 3.78%, “*Dried and Canned Vegetables & Legumes*” by 1.85%, and “*Meat & Poultry*” by 0.97%.

It is worth noting that computing the CPI (inflation) is based on a basket of consumables that includes (850) commodities, of which (325) are food commodities and (525) are non-food commodities.
