Department of Statistics: Consumer Price Levels Remain Stable in Last February

Price Index Change Rate During February Reached 1.17% and 1.11%
During the 1st Two Months of 2026

Prices Change Rate During the first months of 2026 is lower than the
Recorded Levels in the same period in 2025

The Department of Statistics issued its monthly report on the Consumer Prices Index (CPI), which observed an increase by 1.17% during February 2026 compared to the same month in 2025, and a slight increase by 0.22% (less than one percentage point) compared to January 2026. On the cumulative level, the CPI for the first two months of 2026 was increased by 1.11% compared with the same period in 2025.

Comparing the prices growth rates during January and February of 2026, it is noted that these rates are less than the recorded levels in 2025, which is demonstrated below:

On the commodity groups level, the increase in the CPI of February 2026 is mainly attributed to the “*Personal Effects*” group by 40.00%, “*Oils & Fats*” group by 13.95%, “*Tea, coffee, and cocoa*” by 11.95%, “*Fruits and Nuts*” group by 5.19%, and “*Tobacco and Cigarettes*” by 3.99%. Meanwhile, there were decreases in the “*Meat and Poultry*” by (7.43%), “*Household Appliances*” group by (3.24%), “*Fuel and Lights*” by (2.07%), and “*Transportation*” group by (1.48%).

Comparing the CPI of the first two months of 2026 to the same period of 2025, the price index was increased for the “*Personal Effects*” group by 39.47%, “*Oils & Fats*” group by 13.70%, “*Tea, coffee, and cocoa*” by 11.99%, “*Fruits and Nuts*” group by 4.71%, and “*Tobacco and Cigarettes*” by 3.99%. Meanwhile, the “*Dried and Canned Vegetables and Legumes*” group and the “*Fuel and Lights*” group recorded a decline by 2.09% and 1.48% respectively.

Tables (3 & 4) demonstrate the monthly and cumulative relative change for main commodities that constitute the CPI.

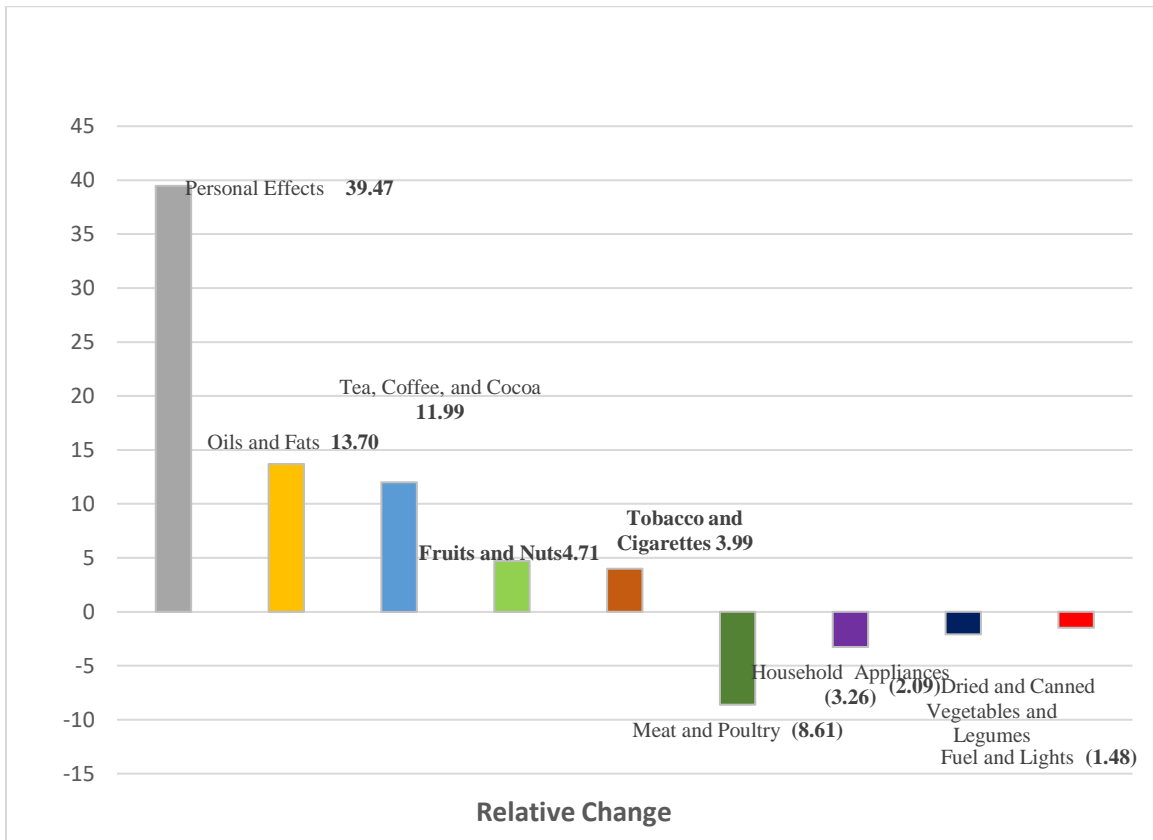

The figure below demonstrates the main commodity groups whose prices were increased, as well as those whose prices were decreased during the first two months of 2026 compared to the same period in 2025.



It is worth noting that computing the CPI (inflation) is based on a basket of consumables that includes (850) commodities, of which (325) are food commodities and (525) are non-food commodities.
