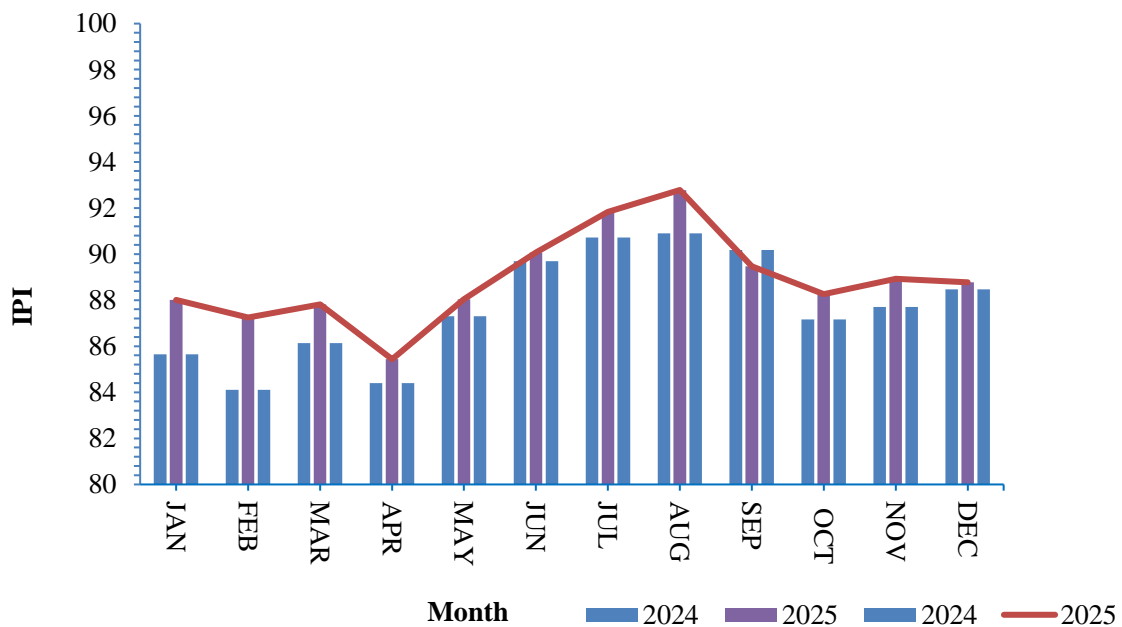

Department of Statistics: Industrial Production Quantities Grew by 1.29% in 2025

The Department of Statistics released its monthly report on the Industrial Production Index (IPI), which showed a 1.29% IPI increase in 2025 compared to the same period in 2024. On a monthly basis, the IPI of December 2025 recorded an increase by 0.35% compared to December 2024, and an increase by 0.52% compared to November 2025. Note that the base year has been modified to **(2018=100)** instead of **(2010=100)**.

Accordingly, the IPI for 2025 had reached 88.84 compared to 87.70 for the same period in 2024. On a monthly basis, the IPI of December 2025 reached 88.78 percentage points compared to 88.47 in December 2024. Additionally, the IPI of December 2025 reached 88.78 compared to 88.32 in November 2025.

Comparing the cumulative IPI for 2025 to the year 2024, there were increases in the production quantities of the “*Manufacturing Industries*” sector by 1.17%, with a relative importance of 88.7%, the “*Quarrying Industries*” sector by 1.16%, with a relative importance of 5.4%, and the “*Electricity Production*” by 2.82% with a relative importance of 5.9%.

On the monthly change domain, the IPI of December 2025 compared to the same month of 2024 has increased due to the increase in the production quantities of the “*Quarrying Industries*” sector by 11.64%, with a relative importance of 5.4% and the quantities of “*Electricity*” sector by 1.94%, with a relative importance of 5.9%. Meanwhile, the production quantities of the “*Manufacturing Industries*” sector decreased by (0.40%), with a relative importance of 88.7%.

At the sectoral level, and by comparing the IPI of December 2025 with the IPI of November 2025, there were increases in the production quantities of the “*Quarrying Industries*” sector by 0.36%, with a relative importance of 5.4%, and the production quantities of “*Electricity*” sector by 21.0%, with a relative importance of 5.9%. Meanwhile, the production quantities of the “*Manufacturing Industries*” sector decreased by (0.70%), with a relative importance of 88.7%.

It is worth mentioning that computing the IPI relies on a selected sample from the *Industrial Establishments Survey*, which collects monthly data from about 300 industrial establishments.
